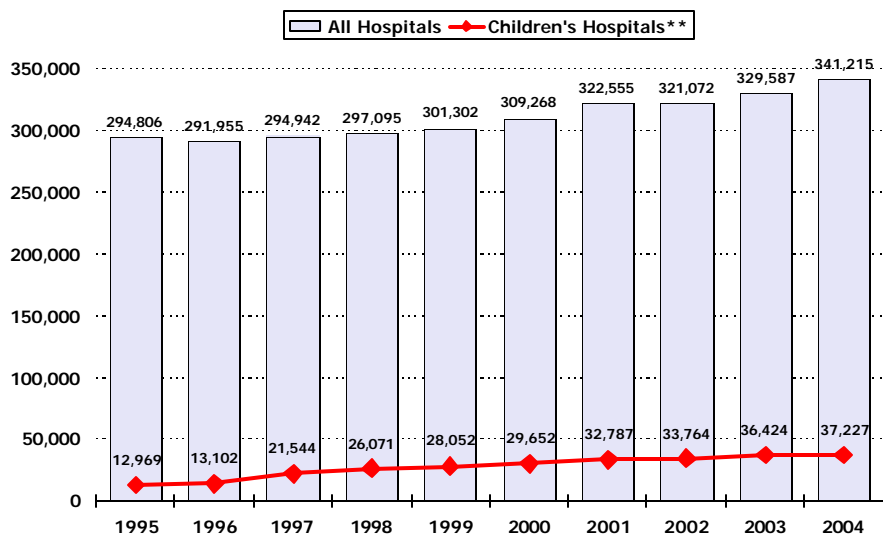




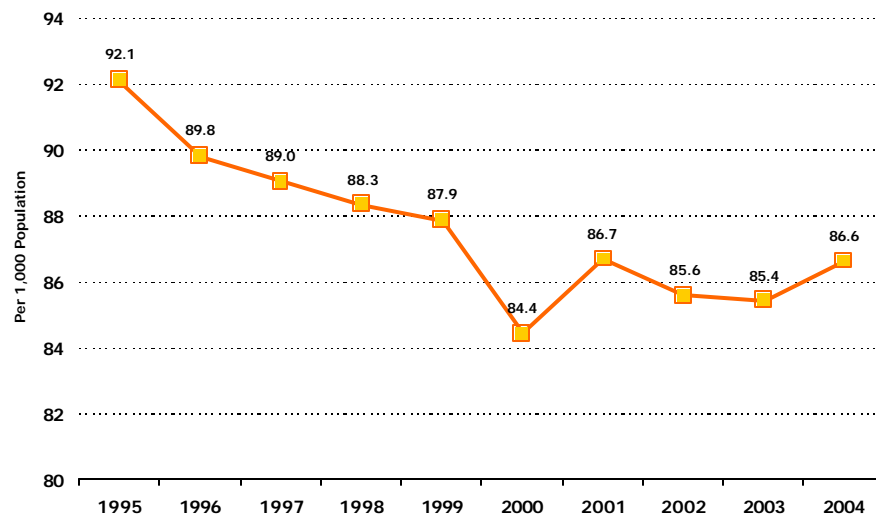

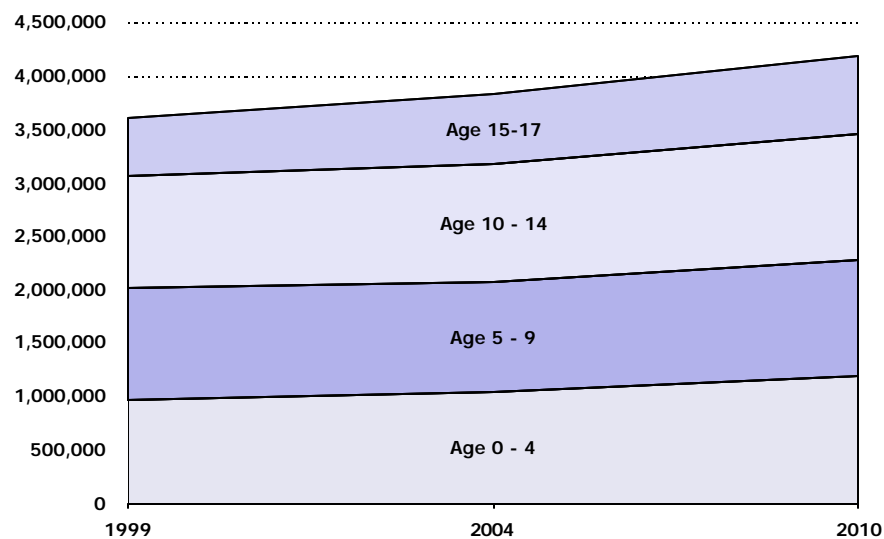
### Pediatric Admissions\* 1995 - 2004



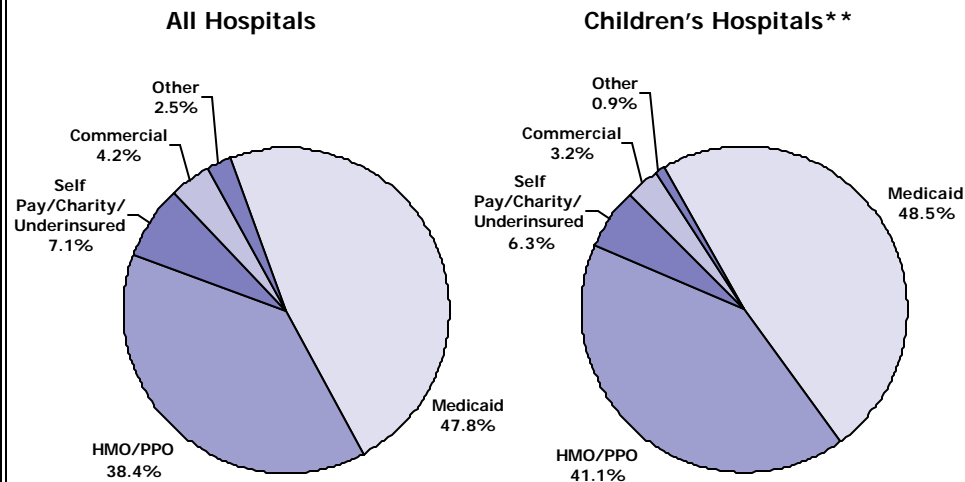
### Pediatric Admissions per 1,000 Population 1995 - 2004



### Pediatric Population Trends 1999, 2004 and 2010



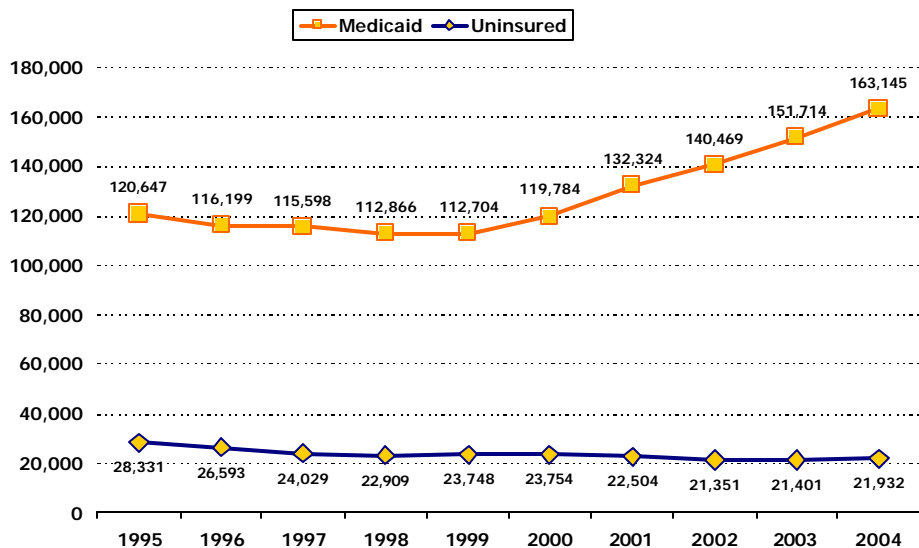
### Pediatric Payer Mix 2004



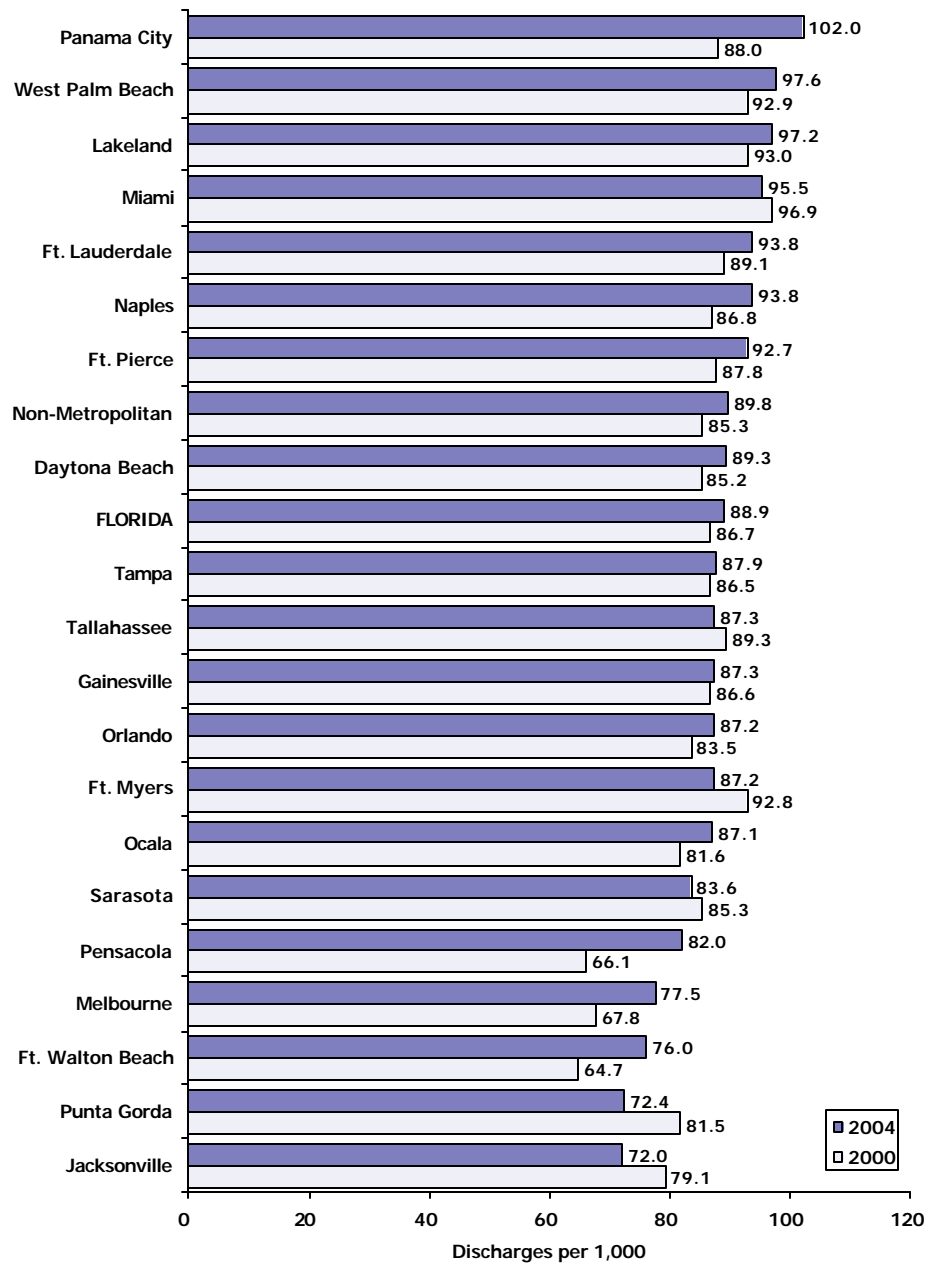
